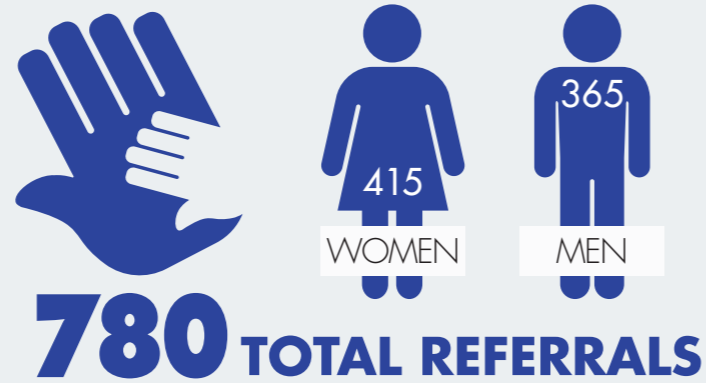

What we found...



- 25% Physical Harm
- 22% Emotional / Psychological
- 15% Self Harm
- 13% Financial / Material Harm
- 11% Self-neglect
- 11% Neglect and Acts of Omission by others
- 3% Sexual Harm

What we did 2018 - 2020

- Continued to review Public Protection support arrangements whilst maximising resources
- Developed and delivered an Operational Oversight process to support multi-agency public protection
- Ensured continuous improvement of adult support and protection practice
- Continued to ensure any learning from our investigations and other investigations both locally and nationally are disseminated to the workforce



- 738 E-Learning Places delivered
- 71% of Social Workers trained as Council Officers



- Working together to ensure the human rights and voices of people at risk of harm continue to be respected and central to our adult support and protection practice
- Ensure partnership arrangements developed in response to COVID-19 continue identifying and responding to new risks identified in our communities.
- Ensure practice expectations and standards continue to improve

What can I do if I am worried?

Don't ignore it.

If you are worried that you or someone you know is being harmed; or is experiencing neglect, it is important to tell someone. That person can be a friend or a person you trust, or the contacts on this leaflet.

Do you need to give your name?

Any information you give will be treated with care. If you do not give your name, inquiries can still be made into the person's care and welfare.

Who can you tell?

If the person is in immediate danger, dial 999

Otherwise, contact your local social work services or you could speak to a health professional. They will all take your concerns seriously.

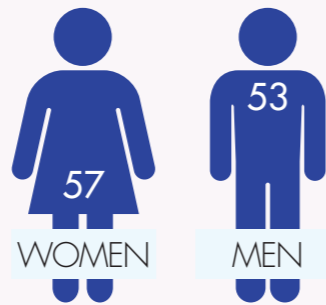

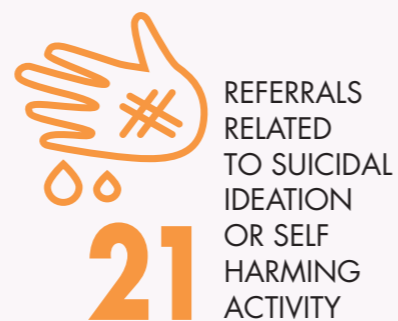
Northern Locality

TOTAL REFERRALS: 110



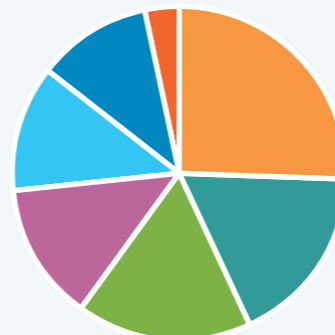
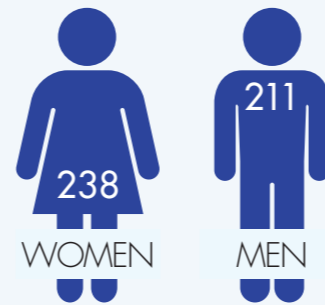

TOTAL REFERRALS: 449



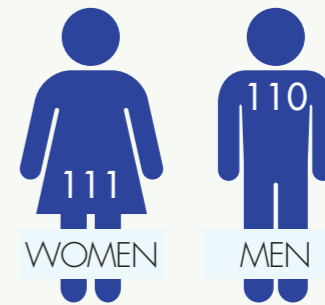
