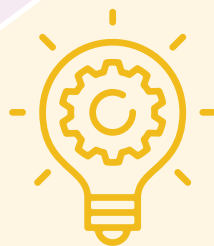

What we are doing NOW



Forming an Ayrshire Group to continue working together to improve the impact of adults at risk of harm as a result of self-neglect



Ensuring young people receive positive transition to adult services, particularly where there are protection concerns



Continuing to improve our engagement with adults with lived experience utilising Active Outreach



Police Scotland Ayrshire Division have developed a 2-day learning session on ASP to provide a cache of officers who are ASP Champions



Developing tools to support multi-agency engagement at ASP Case Conferences.

What we are doing THIS YEAR



Engage our Council Officers in Safe & Together learning sessions to improve their understanding of domestic violence and the whole family approach.



Undertaking an annual multi-agency self-evaluation of Adult Support and Protection in respect of adult at risk of harm who have a learning disability.



Analysing of Child and Adult Learning Review Activity to outline themes emerging to enable us to understand the common areas for future consideration, improvement and learning



Working locally and nationally to improve outcomes for those experiencing Financial Harm



Undertaking a self-assessment in our Care Homes that identifies potential gaps and areas for improvement



Self-assessing our readiness in relation to integrating a Trauma Informed Approach

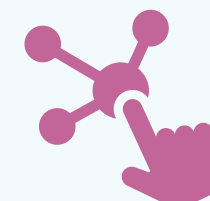
What we will do NEXT YEAR
