<p>WELCOME / APOLOGIES</p> <p>Neil welcomed everyone to the meeting and apologies were noted as above.</p> <p>Neil noted that he attended a Scottish Government ADP meeting which discussed the updating of the memorandum of understanding which was created in 2009 in respect of the Rights, Respect & Recovery strategy. Neil noted that all ADPs will be consulted on this.</p> <p>1. Neil noted there was a partnership bid to the Corra Foundation for empowering recovery.</p> <p>A recovery co-ordinator post has been advertised and the closing date is soon.</p> <p>Neil noted that the DAISy system is now anticipated to go live at the end of 2019.</p>	
<p>MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING</p> <p>2. The minute of the previous meeting held on the 14 December 2018 was circulated and agreed as an accurate record of the meeting.</p>	
<p>MATTERS ARISING</p> <p><u>Alcohol Profile</u></p> <p>The alcohol profile was presented to ADP leads at a joint meeting in January with East Ayrshire and the Scottish Government.</p> <p><u>Rights, Respect, Recovery</u></p> <p>In terms of the Quality Improvement Framework which is currently under development, Neil noted that there would need to be a clear plan and proposal prior to an invitation being extended for Mark to attend and present to the ADP.</p> <p><u>Best Bar None</u></p> <p>The Best Bar None awards took place at the Park Hotel and three Kilmarnock venues received Gold awards, four received Silver and two received Bronze. The Fairburn Hotel in Mauchline also received an award for best newcomer. It was noted that Police have reported a drop in anti-social and violent behaviour in Kilmarnock town centre.</p> <p>3.</p>	

	<p>Fiona noted that the Best Bar None training is now also used in the induction process and has enabled building better relationships with young people who may have come from difficult backgrounds.</p>	
4.	<p>DRUG RELATED DEATHS</p> <p>Liam introduced the Drug Related Deaths briefing for consideration by the group. It was noted that the Kilmarnock Standard included a front page story this week on the issue. It was noted that as of 20th February there have been nine suspected drug related deaths in East Ayrshire, and although the three most recent occurred within two days of each other, there are no common links.</p>	
5.	<p>RECOVERY ORIENTED SYSTEM OF CARE</p> <p>Liam presented the Recovery Oriented System of Care briefing to the group and noted that in the Rights, Respect and Recovery report, there is a clear need to develop ROSC. Liam also noted that work is underway to establish a group of peer researchers and to survey local ROSC partners and assess performance against quality principles.</p> <p>It was noted that a Corra Foundation bid has been submitted and if this is unsuccessful, the group will need to consider the implications of this and consider other routes to achieve the ROSC improvement.</p>	
6.	<p>SERVICE IMPROVEMENT</p> <p>Liam introduced the Service Improvement briefing to the group. It was noted that a Recovery Coordinator post has been advertised and work is ongoing towards to provision of an addictions ‘front door’ service.</p>	
7.	<p>UK GOVERNMENT DRUG CONSULTATION</p> <p>Fraser introduced the UK Government Drugs Policy Inquiry Consultation briefing to the group. It was agreed at a previous Advisory Group meeting that advice from other ADPs be sought to gather information for use in the response. It was agreed a response will not be taken forward for this.</p> <p>It was noted that there is another consultation currently from the Scottish Affairs Select Committee which is due on the 14 April. It was agreed this would be tabled at the next Advisory Group meeting and then brought back to this group for consideration.</p>	

<p>8.</p>	<p>ADP MARKETING</p> <p>Liam presented the ADP Marketing briefing to the group and noted that it had been previously agreed by the ADP not to produce specific ADP branded information and materials. However, as the profile of the ADP has increased it has been suggested that this decision be reviewed. Linda noted that the focus should be less about 'marketing' and more about promoting which resources are available and sharing success stories. Fiona agreed that a single point of contact should be made available for all information.</p> <p>It was suggested that the development of an app may be useful for this and this may be a possible project for Kilmarnock College to take on.</p> <p>It was agreed that this should be looked at in more detail and will be brought to the next Advisory Group.</p>	
<p>9.</p>	<p>AOB</p> <p>Kenny Hankinson noted that CPR equipment is now available for partners to book out for training. There are three kits available, with each kit allowing for three/ four people to be trained at once. It was agreed that a session should be arranged for after the next ADP Committee meeting.</p>
