Welcome and Introductions:

Heather McCormick, thanked everyone for attending and welcomed the new YOYP Young People's Cabinet Members. Having gone over the agenda for the day, Heather asked Councillor Leitch as Children's Champion to take to the floor to speak about the exciting opportunities the group have responsibility for throughout the Year of the Young People.

Year of Young People 2018

Cllr Leitch spoke about how passionate she was to be involved with the group and hoped to help the Cabinet produce quality work to ensure the YOYP Plan would be taken forward. She explained that she was a "driver" for all young people and especially supportive of the Cabinet and was genuinely happy to be involved in this fabulous "ground-breaking" forum for young people. She went on to explain that although her position as Children's Champion meant she wasn't exactly a portfolio holder: she felt that she would like the Cabinet Members to consider choosing to be part of her remit as it would be great to have young people involved in the work she does. And she would love to share this and get feedback from young people on her work as Children's Champion.

Cabinet Executive Group Update

Cameron Raeside gave a brief update on the work the Executive Group have been involved in as part of the year of the young people plan, and what is in the planning stages for the coming weeks.







Some members of the Executive Cabinet took part in the Celebrations as part of the Year of the Young People.

He spoke about meeting with Elected Members and Officials and the support they showed to the group whilst celebrating the opening event of LGBT History Month by being part of the "Fly the Flag" Event at Council Headquarters on 1st February 2018.

Cameron also explained that the Executive Committee had met to discuss ideas for the Year of the Young People Launch with the Youth Work Team and the group decided on a Colour Run. The date for the Launch was agreed as Thursday 15th February. The Executive Group was invited to a presentation from Ayrshire Hospice and Scottish Health Council on 12th February; to be part of a research document of young people's perceptions and understanding of Hospice's in Scotland. All Ayrshire Councils have been invited to take part, however they have only had the invitation accepted by East Ayrshire and this is a great opportunity for our group to have an input.

Various local Forum members and LGBT members have also been invited to a Year of the Young People Empowerment Residential to work on Presentation and Committee Skills, and Young People's Mental Health. This will run from 13th to 14th February at Inverclyde Sports Centre. This is only the start of the work we are part of making a valuable contribution to this year.



Participatory Budgeting

Heather introduced Margaret MacBain, to the Cabinet to talk about Participatory Budgeting for Young People; and ask the group to think about applying on behalf of the groups / forums etc that they are members of.

What is PB?

Participatory budgeting (PB) is recognised internationally as a way for local people to have a direct say in how, and where, public funds can be used to address local needs. PB originated in Porto Alegre, Brazil in the late 1980s and has since spread throughout the world. As part of the YOYP we have the opportunity to have funding available for young people to apply for in East Ayrshire. There is £60,000 for young people alone who has a project or idea that will benefit their community. Margaret explained that the Executive Group had set the criteria for East Ayrshire Applications and the closing date was 15th February 2018.

The executive group will shortleet the received applications on Friday 16th February and those who are successful will be asked to attend a market stall event to promote their programme/idea to which people will vote on.

Margaret was very helpful in answering questions and clarifying the guidelines etc to the group.
