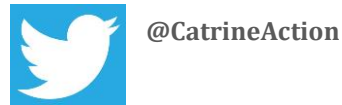


CATRINE CAP STEERING GROUP

What has happened this year?

PARTICIPATORY BUDGETING PROJECTS



Last year various community groups were successful in securing monies from a local PB event.

Poo Stations are now in place at Mill Green and Sorn Street. Painting of the bollards has taken place and Mill Square has been cleaned and tidied with new flowers planted.

JOINT COMMUNITY EVENTS



Since the launch of the Action Plan there have been various events between groups in the village, including popular Christmas and Halloween social events with hundreds of members of the local community attending.

There have also been clean up events taking place at the Old Coach Road, church steps and the war memorial.

COMMUNITY ASSET TRANSFER



A sub-committee of Catrine Community Trust have been looking after the AM Brown on a management agreement with East Ayrshire Council.

A newly formed group, Catrine Heritage Action Team are currently looking at acquiring and developing the AM Brown, alongside other heritage projects.



A sub-committee of Catrine Community Trust has been looking after the Games Hall on a management agreement with East Ayrshire Council.

The committee are looking to constitute as a charitable organization and take on a lease of the building.

FUTURE PLANS
