4	<p><b>Reports:</b></p> <p>A written report was received from the Business Group on their activities since the last meeting. <b>Noted.</b></p> <p>The Windy Standard Wind Farm contract has now been signed and delivered to the developer who has told us that the project was due to be commissioned in the summer. Therefore we can expect the first payment of Community Benefit to be paid 60 days later.</p> <p>It was reported that the number of lorries using the New Cumnock roads to supply concrete to the Afton Wind farm Development was likely to be by 60 per day (120 return trips).  agreed to write and express the Community Councils Concerns about the cumulative effect of this level of traffic with East Ayrshire roads alliance.</p> <p>Concern was expressed regarding the safety of the road bridge near the railway station. reported that engineers had told him it was safe. Concern was also expressed about the Boig Road bridge by . confirmed that EAC had told him it that this bridge was safe. Further investigations were needed.</p> <p>had agreed a meeting with (Transerve) regarding the railway bridge in the Town Hall on the 10<sup>th</sup> May. Interested persons were encouraged to attend and was going to establish the time of the meeting.</p> <p>reported that the Fun Day has now been postponed until after the Junior Cup Final and would now be held on the 8<sup>th</sup> July. was to be supplied with a list of the windfarm companies to be approached as potential sponsors.</p>

[redacted] had attended a meeting of the Coalfield Communities Federation who were organising a free training day in May. Details would be circulated and members were encouraged to attend. It was decided that [redacted] would attend their meetings.

[redacted] reported that he was trying to get a group together to organise events around the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Knockshinnoch Mining Disaster due to take place in 2020. It was reported that the memorial needed repair. [redacted] to report on how this is developing

[redacted] reported that a certificated first aid course had been organised for the 11<sup>th</sup> June from 1pm-5pm in the Town Hall. Organisations in the village were encouraged to put forward names of people to take part. The course was being paid for by the funds obtained through the PB exercise. [redacted] would be asked to advertise this on the Facebook page.

A Hustings meeting had been organised in the Town Hall on the 27<sup>th</sup> April for the candidates standing in the EAC election for Ward 8. Members were asked, if they could, to turn up at 6.30 to help with stewarding duties.

A discussion was held regarding the situation at Grievehill where there was a problem with water. [redacted] and [redacted] would liaise on this and contact anyone necessary to report the matter to the relevant authorities.
