A detailed report on the current condition and recommendations for improvement was completed. The report was used to attract additional funding, from Ayrshire LEADER, Coalfield Regeneration Trust and the Community Futures Fund to recruit a regeneration officer to try to progress the vision in the report. East Ayrshire Council Planning & Economic Development Section was approached to look at funding a pilot scheme to carry out cosmetic improvements to identified buildings in the report. £15,000 was secured for this purpose. Prominent buildings that would have a real impact on the look of the village were identified and agreement sought from the property owners on what work could be carried out and estimates for this work were obtained. To date the following buildings have undergone improvements with grants from the building improvements fund: 18 High Main Street, the Greengrocers, the exterior frontage was painted and new signage installed The Fruit & 13 High Main Street contains two shops, the florist had a bespoke window to match the original manufactured and installed, the exterior frontage painted and window decals installed. The café exterior frontage was painted and window decals installed

#### Priority 1 Progress to date

- 4 High Street, a butchers shop, had a new window canopy installed.



21 Main Street, a vacant shop, was purchased by a hairdresser who owned the adjoining shop and converted into a beauty salon. Assistance was given to carry out the exterior frontage painting, new windows installed to match the adjoining shop, new signage and window decals installed.



 The Eglinton Hotel, Main Street, had the original sandstone facia cleaned of paint, stonework repointed and repaired and new signage installed.



 Two buildings 2 & 8 Main Street are still to be completed. 2 Main Street, a butchers shop, has had the cast iron guttering and downpipes replaced with new cast iron guttering and downpipes and is awaiting painting. Number 8 has had old signage removed, some stone work repaired and is awaiting painting.
