

Cinema Conditions

1. The licensee or the responsible manager, his depute for time being or occupier of the premises, shall immediately communicate to the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service any outbreak of fire, however slight.
2. All attendants on duty to assist persons entering or leaving the Auditorium shall wear a distinguishing uniform, armband or badge.
3. No film shall be exhibited unless:-
 - (a) it has received a "U", "12", "PG", "15" or "18" certificate of the British Board of Film Classifications; or
 - (b) it is a current news-reel which has not been submitted to the British Board of Film Classification.
4. No person apparently under the age of 18 years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received an "18" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
5. No person apparently under the age of 15 years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received a "15" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
6. Notwithstanding the conditions herein before contained, a film may be exhibited or persons or any class of person may be admitted hereto if the permission of the licensing authority is first obtained and any conditions of such permission are complied with.
7. A representative or written statement of the terms of any certificate given by the British Board of Film Classification shall be shown on the screen immediately before the showing of any film to which it relates and the representation or statement shall be shown for long enough and in a form large enough for it to be read from any seat in the Auditorium.
8. There shall be prominently exhibited at each public entrance whenever the premises are open to the public a notice indicating in tabular form and in clear bold letters and figures:-
 - (a) the title of each film to be shown on that day, other than trailers and films of less than five minutes duration;
 - (b) the approximate times of commencement of each such film
 - (c) whether each such film has received a "U", "PG", "12", "15" or "18" in any advertisement of the film displayed at the premises.

9. The nature of any certificate received in respect of a film from the British Board of Film Classification shall be clearly indicated by the letter "U", "PG", "12", "15" or "18" in any advertisement of the film displayed at the premises.
10. No advertisement displayed at the premises of a film to be exhibited at the premises shall depict as a scene or incident of the film any scene or incident which is not included in the film as certified by the British Board of Film Classification or approved for exhibition by the Licensing Authority, as the case may be.
11. Where the Licensing Authority has given notice in writing to the licensee of the premises objecting to an advertisement on the ground that, if displayed it would offend against good taste or decency or be likely to encourage or incite to crime or to lead to disorder or be offensive to public feeling that advertisement shall not be displayed at the premises except with the consent in writing of the Licensing Authority.
12. Where the Licensing Authority has given notice in writing to the licensee of the premises prohibiting the exhibition of a film on the ground that it contains matter which if exhibited, would offend against good taste or decency or would be likely to encourage or incite to crime or lead to disorder or be offensive to public feeling, that film shall not be exhibited in the premises except with the consent in writing of the Licensing Authority.
13. All exit doors shall be fitted with automatic bolts, of a pattern and in a position (to be approved by the Licensing Authority), the words "Push bar to open" shall be painted in four-inch white lettering on all such doors or a manufactured sign of a size and type approved by the Licensing Authority to be permanently fixed to the door at eye-level.
14. All curtains covering doors or in passages shall be hung on sliding rigs, and shall be parted in the centre, and shall not trail on the floor. Curtains shall not be used at doorways fitted with automatic bolts.
15. Seating provided shall be so placed that there shall be a space of 400mm (1'4") between the front of one seat and the back of the next measured between the perpendiculars, Tip-up seating is to be measured in the lowered position.
16. All passages shall be at least 1100mm (3'6") in width.
17. No standing shall be permitted in the Auditorium.
18. The licensee shall report to the Head of Legal, Procurement and Regulatory Services whenever substantial redecoration or the erection of scaffolding in the Auditorium is proposed. The ceiling will then be examined by an expert, on behalf of the licensee, and the Head of Legal, Procurement and Regulatory Services or person appointed by him shall be present at that examination.

A Certificate concerning the condition of the ceiling in terms of Regulation 14 of the Cinemas Act 1985 shall after such inspection, be forwarded to the Licensing Authority by, or on behalf of , the licensee.

In the event of no inspection being carried out in this matter within five years from the date of the last inspection, then the inspection referred to in said Regulation shall be carried out in the presence of the Head of Legal, Procurement and Regulatory Services, or person appointed by him.

19. Authorised officers of the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service shall be entitled to inspect the premises and the fire appliances therein.
20. The premises shall not be opened on Sundays except with the approval of the Licensing Authority.
21. The premises shall not be allowed to remain open later than 11pm on week days and 11.30pm on Saturdays except with the approval of the Licensing Authority.
22. In special cases the Licensing Authority may add to or dispense with or modify such of these conditions as they think fit.
23. The licensee shall provide a log book in which any irregularities shall be noted by the aforementioned officers of the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service or Police Scotland or the Head of Legal, Procurement and Regulatory Services and such log book shall be produced on demand by an Officer of the Licensing Authority.
24. The use of inflammable film is prohibited.
25. No animals shall be permitted in the premises during the exhibition of a film except guide dogs. The licensee shall not refuse admission to patrons with guide dogs.

NOTE

Each applicant for a licence shall lodge with the application -

A Certificate from the manufacturers, or authorised agents, of the Fire Extinguishers installed in the premises to the effect that all extinguishers have been inspected for internal corrosion and are in a satisfactory condition.

A Certificate from an approved electrician showing that the electrical installations have been inspected and are in a satisfactory condition.
