LATE HOURS CATERING LICENCE

CONDITIONS

- 1. The licence holder shall comply with the requirements of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, the Food Safety Act 1990, as amended, and any Regulations made thereunder, the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974 and all other relevant legislation.
- The licence holder shall take effective steps to ensure that the use of the premises
 for the purpose of late hours catering does not detract from the amenity of the area
 in which the premises are located, and in particular that of occupiers of other
 premises in that area by reason of noise, vibration, smell or fumes or for any other
 reason.
- 3. The licence holder shall ensure all cooking odours must be ducted to above eaves level or otherwise dealt with by alternative arrangements so that no nuisance is caused to adjoining proprietors.
- 4. The licence holder shall ensure that all orders are taken, prepared, packaged, paid for and delivered to the customer prior to the conclusion of the premises licensed hours of operation.
- 5. The licence holder shall have the premises clear of customers by the conclusion of the licensed hours.
- 6. The licence holder shall comply with any written request by an Officer of the Fire and Rescue Service that he/she take steps to (a) prevent fire; (b) to provide means to fight fire; and (c) to provide better means of escape from the premises in the event of fire.
- 7. The licence holder shall take effective steps to ensure that passageways within the premises and means of escape from the premises are kept free and unobstructed at all times.
- 8. The licence holder shall take effective steps to ensure that the premises are adequately lit and ventilated when in use for the purposes of late hours catering.
- 9. The licence holder shall take effective steps to ensure that the premises and all furniture, equipment and toilet facilities are properly maintained in a safe and clean condition, and that all litter is collected and removed as soon as practicable.
 - In particular, the licence holder, prior to the close of late hours trading, shall remove and properly dispose of any litter arising from the business and dropped by clients, as well as other refuse produced or accumulated in the course of trading, and lying on any street, foot pavement or footway within a radius of 25 metres of the trading premises.

- 10. The licence holder shall ensure that adequate and suitable provision is made for the storage and removal of refuse and other waste from the premises in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Environmental Protection Act 1990.
- 11. The licence holder shall ensure that adequate facilities for First Aid are readily available within the premises.
- 12. The licence holder shall take effective steps to maintain order and ensure the safety of the public within the premises whenever they are in use.
- 13. The licence holder shall permit free access to the whole of the premises at any time to a Police Constable, an authorised civilian employee of the police authority or an authorised officer of the licensing authority and shall comply with any order or instruction given by any of those officers for the prevention of annoyance to the public or to the occupiers of any premises or in connection with any emergency or disturbance or on any occasion when such constable or officer in his direction may consider it necessary in the public interest to give such order or instruction.
- 14. The licence holder shall effect and maintain a public liability insurance policy with a reputable insurance company all to the satisfaction of the licensing authority and shall exhibit on demand the policy and renewal receipts to the licensing authority.
- 15. A copy of this licence shall at all times be displayed in some conspicuous place within the premises so that it is available for inspection by any Police Constable, an authorised officer of the licensing authority and members of the public. The licence holder shall not in any way alter, erase or deface his/her licence.
