

## **WHEELED BINS CLEANSING**

### **CONDITIONS**

- 1 The waste water generated from the wheeled bin cleansing process must be screened to remove solid material and grease and be contained for disposal at a disposal point approved by Scottish Water.
- 2 Solid material removed by screening must be contained and disposed of to a licensed waste disposal facility in accordance with the requirements of the Scottish Environment Protection Agency.
- 3 Any chemicals and cleaning products involved in the cleaning process must be approved by Scottish Water and the Scottish Environment Protection Agency and used in accordance with the manufacturers recommended dilution rate.
- 4 Discharge of any waste water or wheeled bin effluent via road gullies or at non approved disposal points will be regarded as an offence. The discharge of waste water generated as a result of wheeled bin cleansing via any approved disposal point will be assessed for volume and strength by Scottish Water.
- 5 The occupier of the premises, where the disposal of waste water is taking place, will be required to apply for formal consent from Scottish Water in terms of the Sewerage (Scotland) Act 1968.
- 6 The licence holder will require to comply with any other conditions or guidance issued by the Council, Scottish Water or the Scottish Environment Protection Agency in respect of Wheeled Bin Cleansing and associated Waste Water Discharge to Sewers.
- 7 The licence holder must register with the Scottish Environmental Protection Agency (SEPA, 31 Miller Road, Ayr Tel, 01292 294000) in terms of the Controlled Waste (Registration of Carriers and Seizure of Vehicles) Regulations 1991 (as amended).
- 8 The licence holder will require to ensure that, particularly during the winter months, all reasonable steps are taken to prevent the unnecessary gathering of excess water in any area of operation which, on freezing, could result in the creation of additional hazards for pedestrians and motor vehicles.
- 9 The aforementioned conditions may be subject to change and the licence holder will be given 21 days notice of any changes in conditions.
