East Ayrshire Churches Homelessness Action - Community Friends	Community Friends runs a drop-in on three afternoons per week, offering hospitality, friendship and advice to people who are homeless or vulnerable in any way. We hope to accompany our clients on outings during 2018, for example trips to the football, cinema or bowling.	£500
Ayrshire Cancer Support - Patient Transport Needs	This project looks to market our services to residents of areas areas such as the Kilmarnock West and Crosshouse, Kilmarnock South, Kilmarnock East and Hurlford locality areas providing support to people diagnosed with cancer and to ensure they receive access to patient transport to enable that person to receive life-saving treatment.	£2000
The Community Café @ Onthank	The Café is run by volunteers who give up their time faithfully each week. Coming to the café not only helps them with the social interaction skills and communication skills but also offers hands on experience in working in a food related environment. In order for this service to continue we need to renew our Food Hygiene Certificate as a requirement of the law.	£500
Alzheimer Scotland - What's Cooking	We would like to set up a cook school for people with dementia within our Kilmarnock Resource Centre. People can refresh old skills, gain new ones and learn about healthy for the brain. Participants can take away their recipe card for future use too.	£2000
Beautiful Inside & Out - Dramatherapy / Music Therapy	This project may contribute to the saving of lives. Our most vulnerable troubled soles and families of suicide victims may access dramatherapy and music therapy at our drop in sessions, as well as on an individual appointment	£2000
North West Women's Group - Resources for Activities	We will use the money to buy resources for the activities the group does at its weekly meetings including baking equipment, craft equipment and materials, flower arranging materials, a new bingo machine and chair exercise equipment. This will allow us to develop the activities we do and offer new opportunities for local women, and make the group more sustainable.	£700
The Holiday Project - Provision of Fresh Fruit	The Holiday Project would like to supply fresh fruit to all of our service users who arrive at our 4 caravans for a week or weekend respite break. We estimate that during 2018 we would assist 511 people, based on last year's figures. We want to encourage adults	£500

The Avenue Childcare Services - Sensory Play Sessions	Children attending our services will benefit from sensory play including some outdoor play supported and delivered by Early Years Practitioners. Play at Home Sensory Lending Bags will be developed and families will be able to carry out activities that they have learnt in the setting at home.	£1704
Shortlees Primary Parents Group - Dynamic Drop-ins	We would like to use this funding to organise more after school clubs for the children not only to provide them with more extra-curricular opportunities but help parents who are college until 4pm. the after school clubs would be focused around promoting health and wellbeing with more outdoor learning, running clubs, rugby & boxing.	£2000
Riccarton Early Childcare Centre - Digital Learning for new S.T.E.M room	These resources will enable us to extend digital learning for the children attending our centre in their ante-pre and preschool years of learning. The resources will be able to be used by all children including children with additional support needs who may have communication delays and these resources will enhance their learning as our surrounding lives are expanding digitally.	£2000
The Wednesday Waffle - Waffle Cooking & Meals	The Wednesday Waffle is a community drop in based in Onthank Community Centre. It runs every Wednesday from 1-3pm with 15-20 members attending on a regular basis. As our group has developed cooking has become a central part of what we do. Every week different members of the group cook a meal for everyone with the group deciding what they'd like to try. We would use the funding we have applied for to ensure that the cost of accessing the Waffle and our cooking classes remain very low.	£1320
Ayrshire Samaritans - Volunteer Recruitment Training	Each year we select and train 15-20 volunteers in April and repeat the process in October, training takes 6 months and costs in excess of £100 per volunteer.	£2000
Centrestage Communities - Community Showcase	This funding will enable us to deliver an aspirational Community Showcase for the people of the North West where the skills and talents of these groups we support can be shared with the community encouraging others to take part in future activities.	£2000
Knockinlaw Community Association - Activity Group	To provide education and cultural visits throughout the year for everyone in the community. This will develop social and life skills and tackle isolation and deprivation.	£776
