



What we will do in response to queries raised

GENERAL POINTS:

- The drop-in session had to be re-arranged to accommodate other school activities at a busy time of the year. As advised on 14 December, we will arrange another similar drop-in session in the new year.

FLOODING ISSUES:

- Flooding was raised as an on-going and long-standing issue raised by several attendees. The school is frequently affected by flooding. We will consult with the flood prevention officer to review the flood defences put in place for Galston PS and a report will be provided.

TRANSPORT ISSUES:

- We will investigate progress on the traffic management assessment agreed at the last public consultation meeting.
- We will undertake a review of the current provision in line with the increased pedestrian traffic to Galston Primary.
- We will formalise the traffic management plan. New disabled parking spaces are needed close to the entrance. Coach spaces have been planned to give the children safe access and egress from the buses. The existing one-way system will be reviewed but is likely to be retained.

INDOOR SPACES:

- There will be acoustic treatment in the new gym hall extension and consideration will be given to addressing the acoustic environment of the shared gym and dining facilities to improve the sound quality in these spaces.
- The dining space will be as shown on the plans. The extended space will ease congestion in the dining room and offer additional space for multi-use activities.
- We will add a window to provide fresh air into the reception office.

OUTDOOR SPACES:

- The Head Teachers of both schools have discussed and agreed the sharing of playground areas. We will develop landscaping proposals to improve the outdoor learning environment. This will provide more soft space linking the active play areas of the two schools.
- We will incorporate the “walk a mile” masked pathway into the Landscaping/Playground Design which will be produced in consultation with both Head Teachers/Pupil Councils.
- The material we are considering for the covered area would be translucent which would allow light through but bird droppings would not be obvious from below.
