

## Stewarton Shared Action Plan - Projects List

### Purpose and Status

This Shared Action Plan outlines live and recommended projects and initiatives identified in the preparation of the Stewarton Development Framework in late 2021 / early 2022, to inform Local Development Plan 2 (LDP2). It is suggested that this Shared Action Plan should be a 'live' and dynamic term of reference for stakeholders and partners as projects are identified, developed, implemented and impacts monitored. It should be reviewed at least every 6 months but a group comprising EAC, representatives of local community groups / organisations, the Key Agencies Group (KAG) and others as deemed appropriate. The current Action Plan (with the 'Project Status' column updated) should be published online as a term of reference for all with an interest in Stewarton.

Project Sponsors, their Partners and wider Stakeholders would be responsible for developing funding and business cases for each project / action as required. Over time it would be anticipated that delivered / completed projects would be 'closed out' and impacts monitored, recorded and lessons learned recorded for subsequent actions in Stewarton (and elsewhere in East Ayrshire).

This Shared Action Plan considers action within and beyond the scope and timeframe of LDP2. It is anticipated that the Shared Action Plan be reviewed and refined through stakeholder and community engagement to ratify priorities and secure buy-in and support for potential partners / stakeholders. It could also be envisaged that this Shared Action Plan be considered a resource for any forthcoming Community Action Planning in Stewarton.
